

Setting up Rates on Wattson01

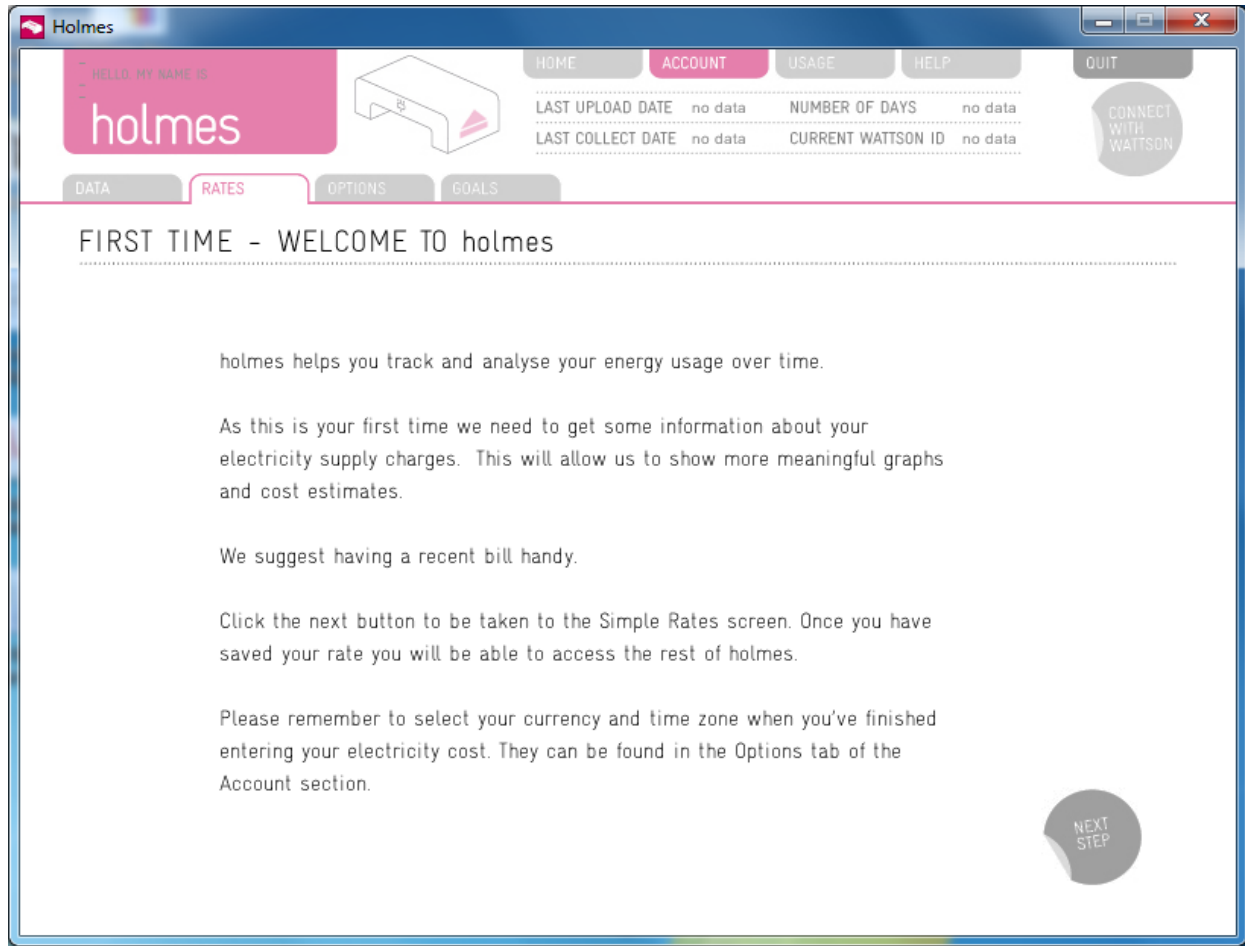


Fig.1 Holmes welcome page

Open Holmes Software, you should see the welcome page in (fig.1).

Click on “next step” tab on the welcome page.

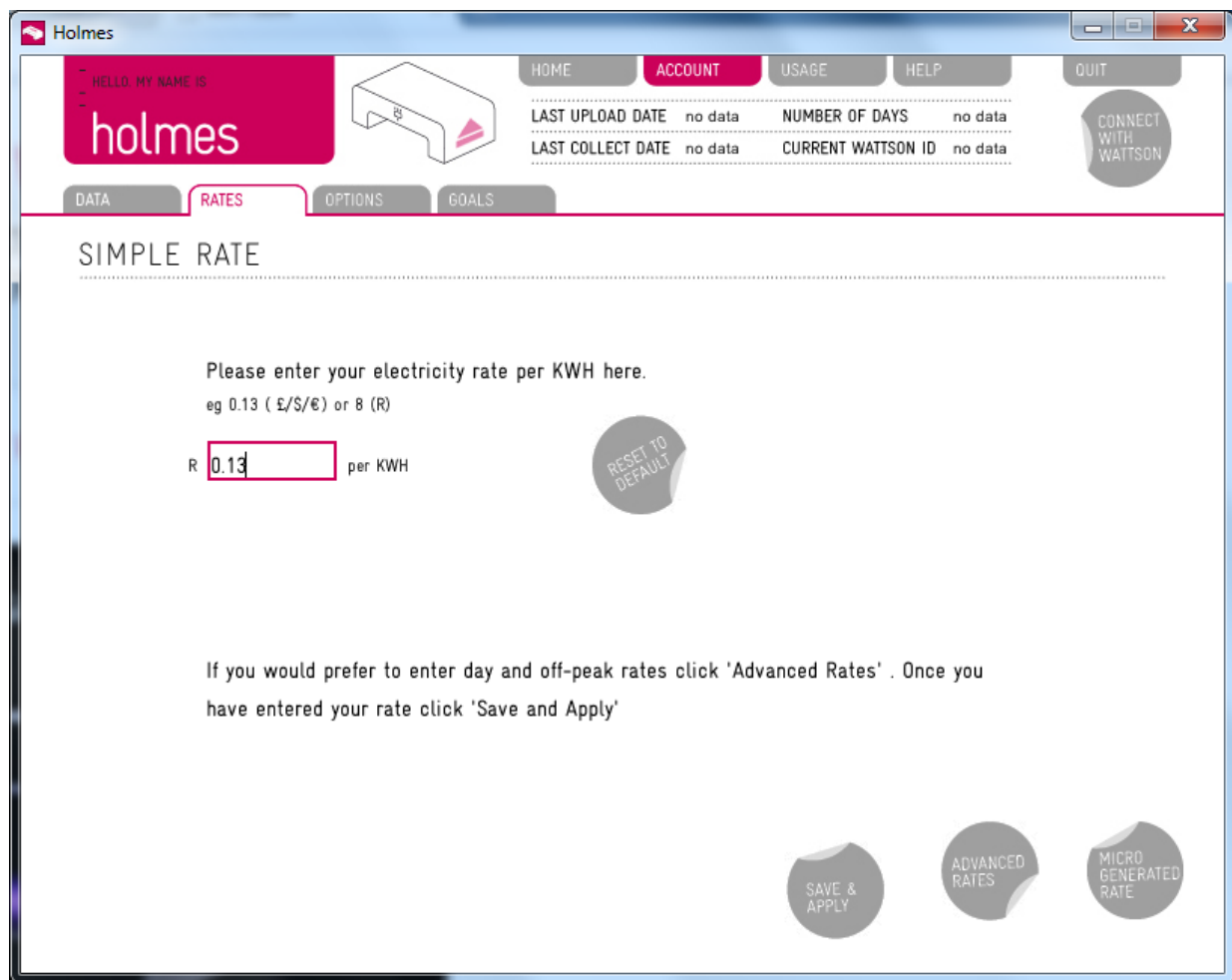


Fig.2 Simple rate page

On the simple rate page (fig.2) click on “advanced rates” tab.

On the advanced rate page (fig.3) select “no” on both questions.

Option 1 – Use rate from electricity bill

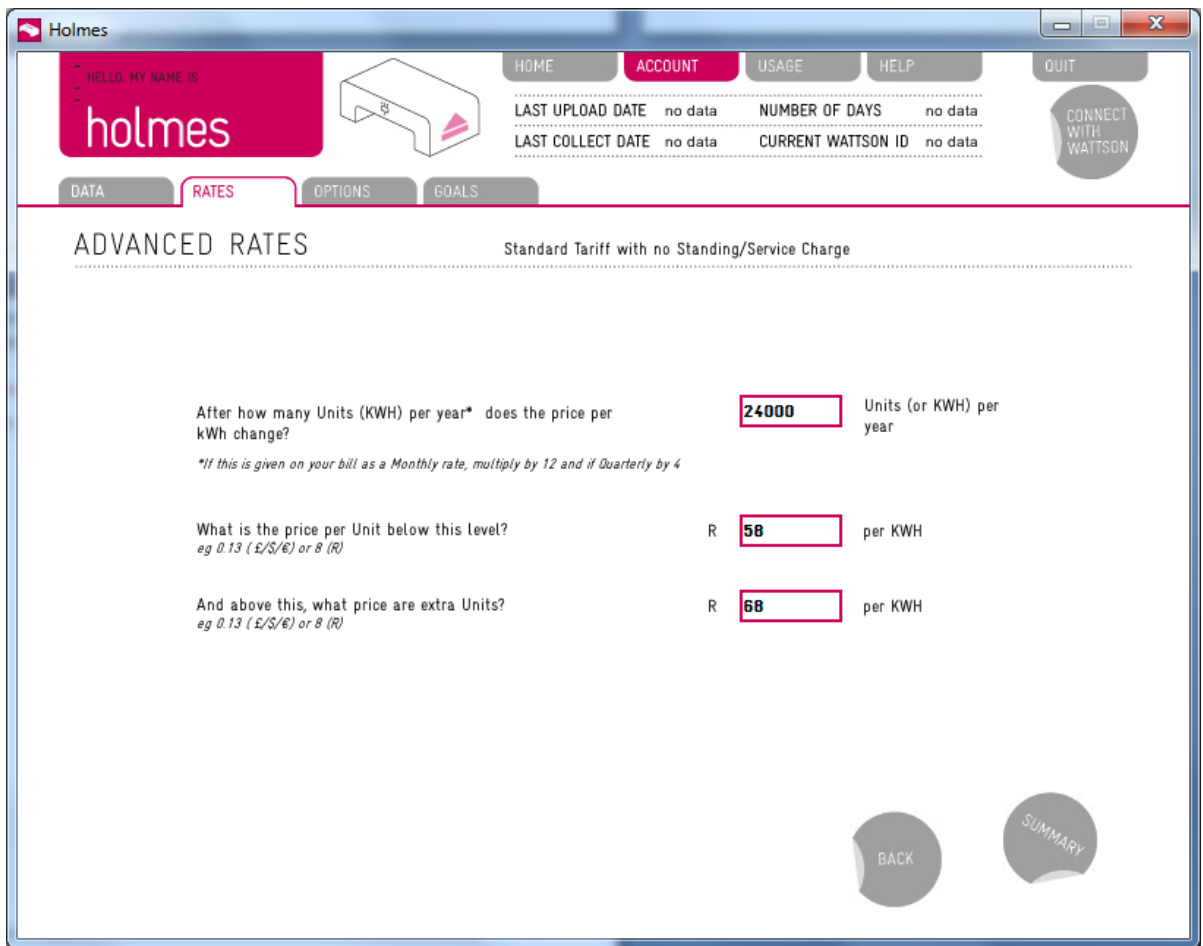


Fig.4 Advanced rate page standard tariff – option2

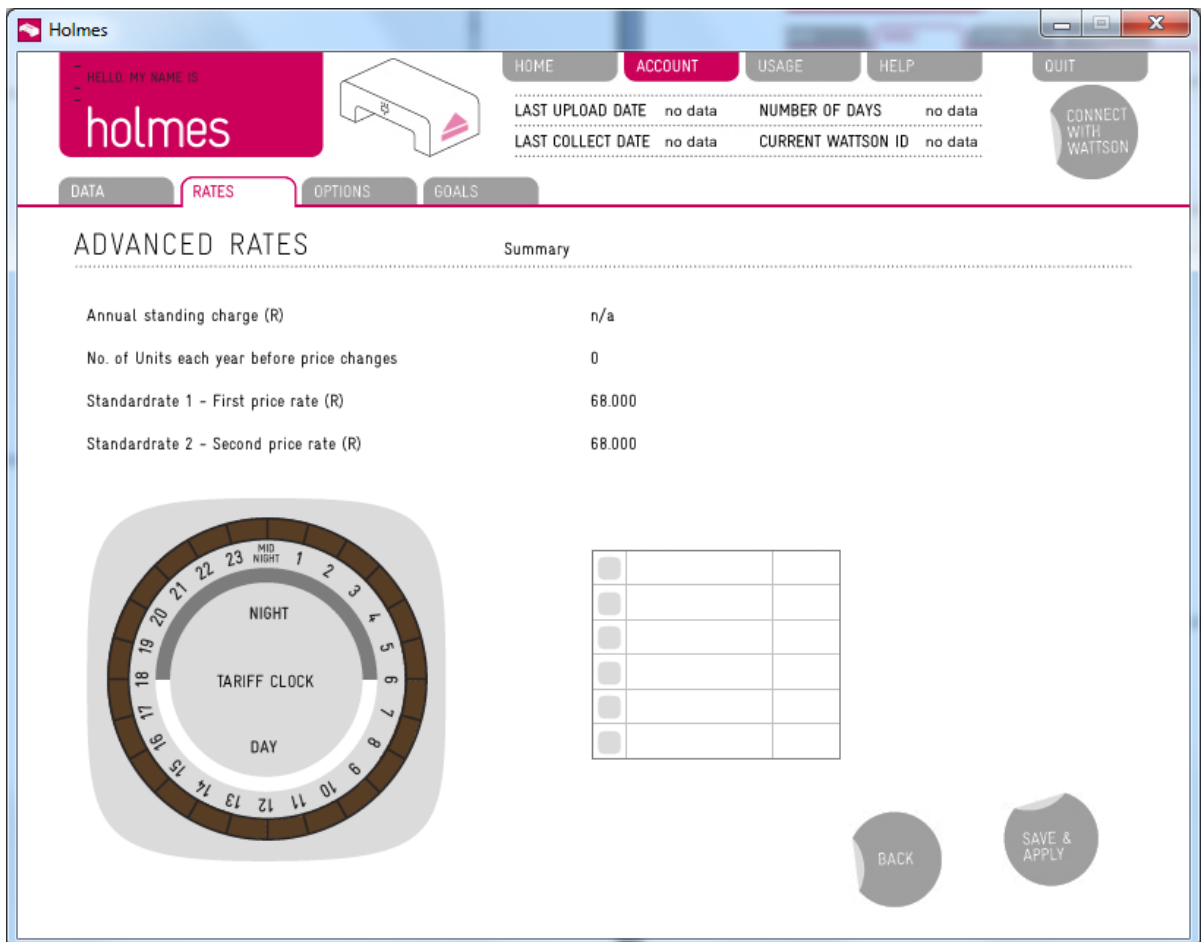


Fig.6 Advanced rate summary

Check your latest electricity bill and obtain the rate per KWH. Enter 0 into the first field as in (fig.4). Enter the rate per KWH obtained from your electricity bill into field 2 and 3 as in (fig.4). Click on the “summary” tab. Check summary detail and click on “save and apply” tab (fig.6)

Option 2 – Use rates from electricity schedule

Check your latest electricity bill to obtain your current monthly consumption in KWH. Obtain the latest rates sheet from your electricity provider. Check which two rate blocks apply to you and what your rates per KWH are for the two blocks. Electricity providers charge higher rates for higher consumption users.

Check what the two closest rates blocks are that apply to you. *(If for example you consume 1800KWH per month then select the following rate block: “1000<2000 58c per KWH” (Which is the block you currently fall in) and also select rate block: “2000<3000 68c per KWH” (Which is the block you have a risk of falling into (this can also be a lower block))).*

Use the lowest block from your two selected blocks, take the amount of KWH that you would need to exceed in order to fall into the next block, multiply it by 12 and enter it into field 1. *(The amount of KWH that you would need to exceed to fall into the next block would be “2000”, thus take “2000” and multiply by 12, getting 24000 which is entered into field 1).*

Field 1 - insert the amount of KWH per year that you have to consume before you fall into the next block and get charged more *(2000KWH * 12months = 24000KWH).*

Field 2 - enter the rate for the KWH in the lower block *(below 2000KWH (“1000<2000 58c per KWH”))*

Field 3 - enter the rate you would be charged should you consume more KWH as entered in field 1 *(above 2000KWH (“2000<3000 68c per KWH”)).*

Click on the “summary” tab. Check summary detail and click on “save and apply” tab (fig.6)
